THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF POWER AND MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTER OF PETROLUEM AND NATURAL GAS (SHRIMATI SUSHILA ROHATGI):

(a) and (b) The following modifications in the existing guidelines have been made with effect from 1-7-1986:

- (i) Income Limit: Subject to the existing stipulations the ceiling of the annual income has been raised from Rs. 24,000 /- to Rs. 50,000.
- (ii) Reservations: While doirg away with the reservation of 25% for Unemployed Graduates (including Engineering Graduates) and adding the same to the 'Open' Category, which is now 55% it has been stipulated that within this category of 'Open' other things being equal, preference will be given to Unemployed Graduates and amorgst them Unemployed Engineering Graduates would be given prior preference.
- (iii) Co-operative Societies: Only such eligible Co-operative societies would now be considered as have shown profits during the preceding 3 years.
- (iv) State Corporations: The existing stipulation to appoint State Government Companies as ad-hoc distributors in cases where a dealership has to be terminated as well as the for hilly and remote areas in respect of LPG distributorships has now been extended to cover SKO/LDO dealerships also.
