Claim applications received by the Oriental Bank of Commerce, Ghaziabad

310. SHRIMATI RATAN KUMARI: Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

(a) what is the number of claim applications received date-wise from January, 1986 to June, 1986 by the Oriental Bank of Commerce, Ghaziabad from the widows regarding succession to deceased depositor;

(b) what is the approximate time to clear such claims especially from widows;

(c) whether all such applications have since been cleared;

(d) if not, what are the reasons for the delay in each case; and

(e) by when all such claims are likely to be finalised?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI JANARDHAN POOJARI): (a) According to the information furnished by the Oriental Bank of Commerce, four such claim applications were received by its Ghaziabad Branch from the widows on different dates (27-3-86, 10-4-86, 3-5-86, and 27.5.86) during the period January, 1986 to June, 1986.

(b) The Bank has reported that the normal time taken to process and clear the claim is approximately 4 weeks.

(c) to (e) Out of four claims, one claim has since been finally settled; two claims have been cleared by the Bank and the claimants requested to submit indemnity bonds for releasing the payments; and in one claim, the claimant was advised by the Bank to submit Affidavit as per Bank's format, which is still awaited from her.

Alleged molestation of a Soviet tourist in Hotel Samrat in New Delhi
