## Attacks on the Capitals of Zambia, Zimbabwe and Botswana by the Security Forces of South African Regime

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI EDUARDO FALEIRO); (a) Oo thi morning of 19th May, 1986, South African security forces carried out armed attacks on Harare, Gaborone, and Lusaka, the Capitals of Zimbabwe, Botswana and Zambia. The raids on Harare and Gaborone were made by ground forces and helicopters ard the one on Lusaka by the South African Air Force. Two persons in Lusaka and one in Gaborone are reported to have been killed and a few persons are reported to have been woun-

- ded. Several buildings were damaged in the attacks on the three capitals.
- (b) to (d) The Government of India views this aggression as part of the South African racist regime's attempts to destab-ilitise neighbouring sovereign states on the pretext of pre-empting attacks on it by Liberation Movements. Government also sees the attacks as a thinly-veiled act of intimidation of Zimbabwe which is to host the next Non-Aligned Summit. India, at the request of the African Frontline States, convened an urgent meeting of Ihe Non-Aligned Coordinating Bureau at New York on 22nd May which condemned the attacks and called for comprehensive mandatory sanctions. India also participated in the UN Security Council dis-cussions on the issue. A Non-Aligned Resolution calling for mandatory sanctions against the Pretoria Regime was vetoed by USA and UK. Need for action by Ihe against internationl community Government of South Africa for its acts of repression against the majority community of South Africa and its acts of aggression against its neighbours will be the main subject of discussion at the forthcoming limited meeting of Commonwealth Heads of Government in London.
