**Army men killed in ambushes by National Socialist Council of Nagaland Activists**

\*216. SHRI K. VASUDEVA PANICKER: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether eleven army men were killed in ambushes by the activities of

the National Socialist Council of Nagaland (NSCN) on July 13, 1986; and

(b) if so, what action Government have taken to curb such activities of the NSCN?

THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI BUTA SINGH): (a) 11 Security Forces personnel have been killed by National Socialist Council of Nagaland (NSCN) activists during this month (and not on 13th July, 1986) as per details given below:

(b) In order to curb the activities of NSCN, the para-military forces have been placed at the disposal of the State Governments of Nagaland and Manipur and the Government of Arunachal Pradesh. Vigil on the borders has been increased. They have been advised to utilise the provisions of the Terrorists and Disruptive Activities (Prevention) Act, 1985, to curb the activities of extremists. Manipur stands declared as 'disturbed area'. The 'disturbed area' belt on the Indo-Burma border has been extended from 5 kms. to 20 kms. in Nagaland and Arunachal Pradesh to check the infiltration of extremists. The State Governments of Nagaland and Manipur have been asked to tighten the security arrangements in banks/treasuries.

**Setting up of Administrative Tribunals**

Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether the State Governments have submitted proposals for the setting up of Administrative Tribunals; and

(b) if so, by when such tribunals are likely to start functioning at all the places selected for the purpose?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRIES OF PERSONNEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES AND PENSIONS (SHRI P. CHIDAMBARAM):

(a) Yes, Sir. Requests from seven State Governments, namely, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra and Orissa have been received for setting up State Administrative Tribunals under the Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985.

(b) Orissa Administrative Tribunal has since been established with effect from 14-7-1986. The proposals received from remaining six State Governments are under consideration. The State Tribunals in respect of these Governments will be established as early as possible.

#### Foreigners in Mallapuram District in Kerala

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) the number of Pakistanis and other foreigners in Mallapuram district and its surroundings in Kerala, who are with out visa or are over-staying there after the expiry of their visa; and

(b) what was their number as on 1-1-84, 1-1-85 and 1-1-86?

THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI BUTA SINGH): (a) According to the information furnished by the State Government, as on 30-6-86, 100 Pak nationals in Mallapuram district and 8 in the adjoining districts of Palghat and Kozhikode were staying beyond the expiry of their visa.

#### Migration from Punjab

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) the number of persons who have migrated from Punjab to outside places, out of fear of terrorism there and also of those employed in the Bharat Heavy Electrical Limited and other industries who have shifted or want to shift from Amritsar and other districts to Chandigarh, etc. due to the same reason; and

(b) what steps have been taken to remedy the situation and what has been its outcome so far?

THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI BUTA SINGH): (a) and (b) According to available information about 1560 families comprising of approximately 7,400 persons have moved out of certain areas of Punjab to other States upto 29th July, 1986 due to extremist activities in the State. There is no information about employees of Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd. shifting from Amritsar to Chandigarh.
