

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI JAGDISH TYTLER): Decisions regarding routes to be operated by Indian Airlines and Vayudoot will be taken keeping in view the economic viability of operations, availability of adequate infrastructure and the resources for development of additional infrastructure and aircraft capacity available.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE (SHRIMATI SUSHILA ROHATGI): There is no such proposal under consideration at present.

**Permission to industrial houses covered by M.R.T.P. to enter Shipping Industry**

(a) whether large industrial houses covered by M.R.T.P. Act have been permitted to enter shipping industry; and

(b) if so, what are the details of the decision taken in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF SURFACE TRANSPORT (SHRI RAJESH PILOT): (a) and (b) Merchant Shipping Act, 1958, does not bar acquisition of ships by M.R.T.P. industrial houses. However, Government have

exempted shipping industry from provisions of Section 21 and Section 22 of the M.R.T.P. Act in February, 1986.

**Draft concept for new population policy**

1050. DR. LOKESH CHANDRA: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have formulated a new draft concept for population policy to push the small family norms; and

(b) if so, what are the details thereof?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI S. KRISHNA KUMAR):

(a) and (b) No new Population Policy has been formulated. The implementation of the strategy to achieve the goals set under the Family Welfare Programme, has been intensified to achieve; (1) increased demand for contraception through improved communication approaches (2) expansion and improvement of the quality of out-reach services; (3) greater community participation; (4) greater coverage of population education; (5) emphasis on child survival programmes; and (6) reorganisation of infrastructure and improving its management.
