Will the PRIME MINISTER pleased to state;

(a) whether it is a fact that Government are examining various proposals to introduce changes in the method of recruitment to the All India and Group 'A' services and in the method of their training; and

(b) if so, the details of the proposal and by when it is likely to be implemented?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PERSONNEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES AND PENSIONS (SHRI P. CHINDAMBARAM): (a) and (b) The scheme of the Civil Services Examination consisting of Preliminary Examination and the Main Examination (Written and interview) for recruitment to the Indian Administrative Services, Indian Foreign Service, Indian Police Service and various non-technical Central Services, Posts Group 'A' and Group 'B' was introduced in the year 1979. This was based on the recommendations of the Committee on Recruitment Policy and Selection Methods under the Chairmanship of Dr. D. S. Kothari set up by the Union Public Service Commission and recommendations of the Commission thereon as accepted by the Government. This Committee had recommended periodic review of the standards of recruitment. Also the Estimates Committee (1983-84) of the 7th Lok Sabha in their 77th report recommended that as by then five examinations had been held under the revised pattern, the new system of the Civil Services Examination should be reviewed. The Government is examining various proposals to introduce changes in the method of recruitment to the All India and Group 'A' Services and in the induction-training of the selected officers. Since no final decisions have been taken, it would not be possible to give any details.

Recommendations of Expert Committee regarding Delhi Fire Service

(b) Some fire stations have been set up and equipments purchased. A fire tax has been levied on the rateable value of property.
