Import

1623. SHRI T. CHANDRASEKHAR: REDDY: Will the Minister o'f COMMER-CE be pleased to state:

- (a)whether it is a fact that there has been increase m imports during the first two months of the current financial resulting in massive trade deficit;
- (b) if so, what are the details thereof and what are the reasons therefor; and
- (c) what steps are being taken to remedy the situation?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE (MINISTRY OF TEXTILES (SHRI KH-URSHED ALAM KHAN): (a) and (b) According to the provisional figures, India's overall imports during > the first two months of the current financial year i.e. April-May, 1985 amounted t_D Rs. 3083.17 crores, and exports Rs. 1568.23 crores, resulting in the balance of trade deficit of Rs. 1514.94 crores.

(c) Policy measures are being continuously evolved for increasing India's exports. These include Measures for increasing and diversifying tire production, making our exports more competitive, finding new markets for our products and processing commodities for higher value ' realisation. Efforts would be made to gear up these measures further during the Seventh Plan period.

The Government has taken a number of policy initiatives in the sphere of trade policies, industrial policies and fiscal policies. The current import-export policy* which will be operative for a three year period, 1985—88, is designed to introduce an environment of continuity and stability in foreign trade planning. It aims at providing a manor thrust towards increased production, bo*h for domestic consumption and exports, and bring about

efficient import substitution. Th^ Government have also identified sectors for export promotion which can make a substantial contribution to growth in exports over the medium tetam. Public! sector ' undertakings are being involved for greater participation in export efforts. Simultaneous efforts are also being made to steps up our indigenous production of importables during the Seventh Five Year Plan period, particularly in the sphere of bulk imports.

Grant of more bonus for Central Government Employees

- (a) whether there is any proposal under Government's consideration to grant one month bonus instead of 17 day_s bonus to the Central Government employees as has been given to the employees of the Telephon_e and Telegraph Departments; and
- (b) if so, by when (he proposal j_s likely to-be implemented?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE 'MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI JAN-ARDHAN POOJARI)., (a) and (b) No, Sir Government have, however recently announced an increase in the ad hoc bonus from 18 to 23 days for-the accounting year 1984-85 to Central Government employees not covered by any of ihe Productivity Linked Bonus Schemes. Formal orders in this regard will be issued in due course.
