Promotion of Indian Statistical Service Personnel

(b) whether the XII and XIII batches of I. S. S. officers are due for promotion; and

(c) if so, the reasons for delay in their promotion and by when they are likely to be promoted?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING (SHRI AJIT KUMAR PANJA): (a) 1984.

(b) As per existing rides of ISS, XII batch of Grade IV officers be came eligible for consideration for promotion to Grade III in September, 1985. The XIII batch officers are not yet eligible.

(c) Grade IV officers will be considered for promotion to Grade III of the ISS as soon as the seniority list of Grade IV officers, which is presentiy *sub-judice* in the Supreme Court ceases to be so.

(b) if so, what are *the* details of the ongoing talks between Government and Mizo National Front Chief on the issue of Mizoram; and

(c) whether it is a fact that the MNF Chief has expressed his intention to go back to London ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF INTERNAL SECURITY (SHRI ARUN NEHRU) :
(a) Yes, Sir.

(b) and (c) Talks are still continuing. It would be in the public interest to disclose any details at this stage.'

Promotion of IAS/EPS Officers

1978. DR. SHYAM SUNDAR MOHAPATRA : Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) the names of IAS officers who have been empanelled as Joint Secretary, but who have not served as District Magistrate or Deputy Commissioner in a district ;

(b) the names of IPS officers who have been promoted as Joint Secretary, but who have not served as Superintendent of Police in a district; and

(c) the names of IAS officers who are presently working in the Central Government in Delhi and have not served as District Magistrates so far ?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATIVE REFORMS AND PUBLIC GRIEVANCES AND PENSION (SHRI P. CHIDAMBARAM) : (a) and (b) A minimum period of service as District Megistrate/Deputy Commissioner in the case of an IAS officer and a

Superintendent of Police in the case of an IPS officer has not been prescribed as a condition for empanelment/appointment as Joint Secretary at the Centre. About 1500 officers belonging to the IAS and IPS have been empanelled for appointment at the level of Joint Secretary at the Centre. Information about the names of IAS/IPS officers who have not served as District Magistrate/Deputy Commissioner/Superintendent of Police is not readily available.

(c) The number of IAS officers posted in Delhi who had not served as District Magistrate/Deputy Commissioner for at least 2 years is 514. However, it may be relevant to add that many of these officers have field experience for two to three years having worked in other field posts like Sub-Divisional Officers, District Revenue Officers, Chief Executive Officers (Zila Parishad), Settlement Officers, District Development Officers etc.

Criteria evolved by Mathew Commission to identify Hindi speaking area

(c) whether Government are negotiating with the General Electric Company of US for 404 engine for the LCA; and

(d) whether the cost of LCA is being revised ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENCE RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT (SHRI ARUN SINGH) : (a) No, Sir The programme is on schedule.

(b) Yes, Sir. Shri Raj Mahindra resigned on the ground that he believed that he did not enjoy the confidence and support of some at higher quarters connected with Aeronautical Development Agency (ADA) administration. Dr. Valluri sent his resignation alongwith. Shri Raj Mahindra's resignation on the grounds that as he had consistently supported Shri Raj Mahindra he too would have to go as he could be deemed to be the person who caused this embarrassment to the Government.
