

**Interview of Frank Camper
regarding terrorist activities**

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state :

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to the interview given by Mr. Frank Camper, who runs a mercenary school in the United States, to the Illustrated Weekly of India with regard to the circumstances of the explosion of the Air India Jet Kanishka and other terrorist activities ;

(b) if so, what were the details of his interview ; and

(c) how far his statements made in the interview were correct and what is Government's reaction thereto ?

THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI B. R. BHAGAT) : (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) In the interview, Frank Camper claims to have warned the Indian Consulate in New York several times about the Sikh terrorist's intention to blow up Air India planes. He also claims to have passed on information to FBI relating to extremist's plan to assassinate the Indian Prime Minister and Haryana Chief Minister Shri Bhajan Lal, sabotage of railway system and nuclear installation creating chaos and instability in India, and blowing up of aircraft.

(c) No such warning has been given to the Indian Consulate in New York at any time. Frank Camper has himself stated that he had no specific information that Air India 182 or any other Air India Plane was going to be hit, during an interview on the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation at 7-28 P.M. on September 10, 1985.

The details of the mercenary training school in Alabama run by Frank Camper were discussed extensively in the Rajya Sabha. A statement was also made by the Minister of State in the Ministry of External Affairs in response to a Calling Attention Notice in the Rajya Sabha on Thursday the 25th July, 1985. Government have nothing further to add.
