- (b) what is the number of casualties and the type of aircraft involved in each of the accidents;
- (c) in what manner the facilities available for training of the Indian Air Force personnel for operation and maintanance of the new generation of aircraft compare with those available for Britain's Royal Air Force and the US Air Force; and
- (d) what measures have been taken by Government to remove the deficiencies, if any, in the fields of operating and maintaining the sophisticated aircrafts to minimise the number of accidents?

THE MINISTER OF STATE THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENCE, RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT (SHRI ARUN SINGH): (a) and (b) It would not be in the public interest to disclose this information.

- (c) Training requirements of the IAF's air/ground crew are being adequately catered for. The faciavailable in the Royal Air lities Force and the U.S. Air Force would not necessarily suit four purposes.
- (d) The Air Marshal A La Committee on Flight Fontaine Safety recommended a number of measures to improve training in the IAF. Most of its recommendations have been implemented. Action to finalise decisions on its remaining recommendations is in hand.
