

On November 14, Shri Rajneesh pleaded guilty of two counts of a thirty five count indictment accusing him of violating US immigration laws and of two charges of lying to immigration authorities. Under a plea-bargain arrangement he received a five, year suspended prison sentence. He also agreed to pay \$ 400,000 fine and leave the country within five days.

Formulation of proposals by the State Government for their respective Annual Plans is the first step of the exercise of formulating the Annual Plans of the States. These proposals are discussed in detail by the Planning Commission with their representatives of the respective State Governments and Plans are finalised keeping in view the available resources. As far as possible, agreed decisions are taken with regard to overall size of the Plans, sectoral outlays and targets. As such there is no question of slashing of targets.
