Department of Space and the technology has now been passed on to Indian industries for large scale production. to meet the continuing requirement of the Department. These include, High Energy Fuel Polybutadyne Fuel Polymers, for solid Propellants and Unsymmetrical Di Methyl Hydrazine (UDMH) for Liquid Propellants. The high energy solid propellant Hydroxy Terminated polybutadyne (HTPB) has been developed on laboratory scale at the Vikram Sarabhai space private Trivandrum. Α company will be producing HTPB for metting ISRO requirements under licence from ISRO.As regards UDMH the ISRO knowhow has been passed on to firms in public and private sectors for meeting requiremnts of ISRO.

(c) and (d) Some of the chemicals which are required in small quantities and in the exigencies of various projects, are imported at standard international prices, as and when necessary.

## Rivers facing acute water pollu-

- (a) whether any measures have been taken to identify the rivers in the country which are facing acute water pollution; and
- (b) if so, what anti-pollution steps have been initiated for their cleaning?

(SHRI Z. R. ANSARI) (a) Yes, Sir River-basin wise studies have bee carried out for all the major rive in the country and polluted stretch have also been identified.

- (b) The anti-pollution steps taken include the following:
  - (1) Ganga Action Plan has been launched for control of pollution of river Ganga;
  - (2) Industries are being persuaded to instal effluent treatment plants and treat their effluents to the prescribed standard before discharing them into water bodies; and
  - (3) Legal action is taken against defaulting units which do not comply with necessary pollution control measures in spite of persuasion.
