THE MINISTER OF STATE IN DEPARTMENT OF CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI JAGDISH TYTLER): (a) The number of passengers carried by Indian Airlines during the years 1982-83, 1983-84 and 1984-85 was 6.847 million, 7.669 million and 8.509 million respectively. It is estimated that during the current financial year

Indian Airlines will carry 9.425 million passengers.

(d) To attract more passengers Indian Airlines has:

(1) introduced promotional fares on certain routes;

(2) a programme of marketing and publicity overseas in collaboration with international agencies.

Meet of later-caste and inter community marriages on Thalassaemia

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI KRISHNA KUMAR):

(a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Pre-marital genetic counselling followed by avoidance of marriage among carriers is the only method to prevent this disease. Alternate method is to implement a programme of screening by ante-natal diagnosis for women at risk of having affected fetuses and use of therapeutic abortion in appropriate cases. The Indian Council of Medical Research has set up a Centre for the latter purpose at Bombay.

Ticketless Travelling on Railways

(a) 4.94 lakh checks were conducted during 1983-84 and 1984-85.

(b) and (c) 82.82 lakh persons were detected travelling without ticket or with improper tickets and a sum of Rs. 1638.12 lakhs was realised from them as railway dues. 4.98 lakhs persons were prosecuted out of whom 2.61 lakhs were imprisoned in default of payment.

(d) Incidence of ticketless travel is not on the increase.
