Air services in Jaiuniu and Kashmir

505. SHRI GHULAM RASOOL KAR: Will the Minister of TRANSPORT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Gores, Tangdar, Poonch, Rajouri and Kistawur are economically backward areas of the Jammu and Kashmir and remain cut off from the country during winter: and
- (b) whether Government propose to provide air services to these areas?

THE MINISTER OF STA1E IN THE DEPARTMENT OF CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI JAGDISH TYTLER): (a) Yes, Sir. These are economically backward areas but not all of them remain cut off during winter.

(b) Subject to economic viability of operations and availability of infrastructure, Vayudoot has plans to provide air services to Rajouri, Poonch and Kista-war.

- (c) what are the reasons of the high casualty by these buses; and
- (d) what is the total amount of compensation by the DTC and private bus owners paid during the above period and what is the maximum and minimum amount of compensation paid so far?

- 507. SHRI J. P. GOYAL: Will the Minister of TRANSPORT be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that a number of persons were killed recently when Ca-char Express rammed into a private bus at a level crossing near Guwahati;
- (b) if so what are the details thereof stating the result of the enquiry, if any, conducted into the accident and the action taken thereon;
- (c) what is the number of unmanned railway level crossings at the beginning

- of 1985 (Division-wise) and how many of these have been manned (till date) as against the target;
- (d) whether any comprehensive plarj has been formulated to man the remaining unmanned railway level crossings; an<J
- (e) if so, what are the details in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF RAILWAYS (SHRI MADHAVRAO SCINDIA): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. On 6-10-1985, while 201 up Ca-char Express was on run between Narangi and Panikhaiti stations on Lumding Division of Northeast Frontier Railway, it collided with a private bus No. ASK 722 at a manned level crossing. As a result, 27 bus passengers were killed and 29 injured. A statutory inquiry has been conducted by Commissioner of Railway Safety, N.E. circle, Gorakhpur into this accident. According to his findings the collision was caused due to the bus attempting to cross the said level crossing whose gates were kept wide open to road traffic in the face of approch-ing Cachar Express. The Gateman and station Superintendi'iit of Panikhaiti station have been held responsible for the accident. Orders for dismissal of Gateman under Rule i4(ii) of Railway Servants Discipline & Appeal Rules have since been issued. Disciplinary action against Station Superintendent has also be?n initiated.
