**Draw of lots for allotment of flats by HUDCO**

751. SHRI F. M. KHAN: Will the Minister of URBAN DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that D.D.A. have prepared a seniority list by draw of lots for allotment of flats to those who have registered their names for flats under Janata, LIG and MIG categories under the HUDCO pattern 1979 scheme; and

(b) whether the registered persons have been intimated of their seniority, if not, what are the reasons therefor and how it is proposed to inform them?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF URBAN DEVELOPMENT (SHRI DALBIR SINGH): (a) and (b) The priority list prepared by the Computer Maintenance Corporation, a public sector undertaking which is doing computerisation work for DDA, has been received in DDA. Publication of the list has been withheld for detailed checking. The seniority list which will include around 1 lakh 35 thousand names, will be made available to the public in the form of a printed booklet within 3 months, through various out-lets.

**Manufacture of baby food**

752. SHRI PARVATHANENI UPENDRA: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that food for infants is manufactured from imported/donated commodities such as skimmed milk powder (SMP) and butter oil (BO);

(b) if so, what are the reasons for remaining dependent on manufacture of baby food by the SMP and BO;

(c) what is the quantity of imported-donated SMP and BO during the last three years; and

(d) what are the steps taken by Government to increase the indigenous output in this field so that there is lesser and lesser dependence on the imported commodities?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND COOPERATION (SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA): (a) The Indian Dairy Corporation is not supplying any imported/donated skimmed milk powder and butter oil to the manufacturers of infant milk food for the production of infant milk food.

(b) Does not arise.

(c) The quantity of skimmed milk powder and butter oil received as gift from EEC/CLUSA during 1982-83 to 1984-85 are as under:

(d) The estimated milk production in the country has increased from 21.60 million tonnes in 1969-70 to 38.74 million tonnes in 1984-85 due to the impact of various Central, Centrally Sponsored and the State Plan Schemes, which also include Operation Flood programmes. The estimated indigenous production of milk powder including infant milk food has increased from 22,354 metric tonnes in 1970 to 95,600 metric tonnes in 1984.
