Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government propose to instal the first 500 MW atomic power plant at Tarapur;

(b) if so, what are the details of the project; and

(c) whether this project is part of a ten year profile prepared by the Department of Atomic Energy; if so, what are the details of the profile?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY AND IN THE DEPARTMENTS OF OCEAN DEVELOPMENT, ATOMIC ENERGY, ELECTRONICS AND SPACE (SHRI SHIVRAJ PATIL): (a) to (c) The Government has, in principle, approved a 15 years Nuclear Power Profile drawn up by the Department of Atomic Energy which envisages setting up of 12 units of 235 MWe and 10 units of 500 MWe Pressurised Heavy Water Reactors at various parts of the country during the period 1985—2000. The location of these future atomic power stations is under the consideration of the Government

Death of Indian Jawans in Kargil

Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to the news item which appeared in the 'Times of India' of 7th October, 1985 to the effect that three Indian jawans were killed when Pakistani troops ambushed them on the Indian side of the line of control in the Kargil sector of Jammu and Kashmir;

(b) if so, what are the details of the incident; and

(c) whether any protest has been lodged with the Government of Pakistan and if so, what action has been taken or is proposed to be taken by Government in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENCE RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT (SHRI ARUN SINGH):- (a) and (b) Government have seen *the* media report in question. On 4th October, 1985, Pakistani troops ambushed a small Indian patrol and killed three of our men in an area north of Kargil in Jammu and Kashmir. Our men were on a routine patrol on our side of the Line of Control when the incident occurred. The Pakistani troops removed the bodies but returned them on 6th October, 1985.
