Other areas proposed for study are Decision Making Processes including Delegation of Powers, Development of Computer System and Streamlining of procedures.

Setting up of Shortwave stations

(b) if so, what are the details in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI V. N. GADGIL): (a) and (b) In its proposals for the draft 7th Plan, AIR has included a scheme to set up 2 numbers of 250 KW SW transmitters, studio facilities at Panaji (Goa). Implementation of the scheme will however, depend upon the final shape of the 7th Plan.

(क) क्या सरकार का ध्यान 28 जून 1985 के "इंडियन एक्सप्रेस" में प्रकाशित चीनी उत्पादकों, वितरकों तथा विक्रेताओं आदि द्वारा फर्जी पर्वी कटने, गन्ने की कम ढुलाई करने, का भुगतान करने, सार्वजनिक वितरण प्रणाली का घटिया चीनी देकर बढ़िया चीनी को मुक्त बाजार में बेचने आदि जैसे साधन अपनाने के कारण उत्पादन के कुल मूल्य के 5 प्रतिशत के बराबर राशी काले धन के रूप में संग्रहीत किए जाने के सम्बन्ध में बढ़ते जा रहे उद्योगों में सम्बन्धित रिपोर्ट की ओर दिलाया गया है ; और

Working of PIB at Delhi

1089. SHRI KAPIL VERMA: Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

(a) whether there is any proposal under Government's consideration regarding reviewing and evaluating the functioning of the PIB at Delhi to improve its working and effectiveness; and

(b) what steps are being taken to ensure effective spotlight of the achievements and policies of Government?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI V. N. GADGIL): (a) The Department of Personnel & Administrative Reforms undertook a study of the working of the Press Information Bureau in the year 1983-84 to streamline the organisational structure and functioning of the Headquarters and Regional/Branch offices of the Press Information Bureau. The study report is awaited.

(b) The Press Information Bureau continuously examines the question of effective publicity for the policies and activities of the Government. The Bureau employs a variety of means—written material, Press Conferences, briefings and conducted tours—to disseminate information on Government policies and activities.

Coverage by AIR

1090. SHRI KAPIL VERMA: Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

(a) what steps are being taken by Government to ensure hundred per cent coverage of the country's population by AIR; and

(b) the expenditure that is likely to be incurred and the number of transmitters that would have to be set up for this purpose?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI V. N. GADGIL): (a) and (b) After the implementation of the schemes included in the 6th Plan, the day time medium wave coverage in the country would extend to 95 per cent by population and 86 per cent of the area.

In its draft 7th Plan proposals, Government has included schemes to increase

the coverage to 97 per cent by population and 91 per cent by area. Implementation of the schemes will, however, depend on the final shape of the 7th Plan.

For 100 per cent radio coverage, AIR would in all require 350 transmitters of different power denominations in medium wave, F.M. and short wave. The present day estimation of expenditure on this account would approx. be Rs 1000 crores.

Railway wagons for movement of fertilisers

(a) what is the requirement of Railway wagons for movement of fertilisers in the year 1985-86;

(b) the number of wagons allotted by the Railways and what is the movement target; and

(c) what alternative steps Government proposed to take to complete the movement target, if wagons are not allotted?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI CHANDULAL CHANDRAKAR): (a) It is not possible to give the exact number of wagons required for movement of fertiliser, as a combination of broad-gauge and metre-gauge wagons are involved in it. However, the approximate requirement is about 1200 broad-gauge and 500 metre-gauge
