(b) and (c) Though a norm of 1 d per 1000 population has been pre-i-ibed, it is not possible to lay down 5 beds required in each of the hos-tals of Delhi. The problem is being :kled by Opening of more Govt, ispitals. At the moment two hos::als with a bed strength of 500 ch are in the process of being com-ssioned at Hari Nagar and Shah-ra. Another three hospitals of 100 ds each are being planned at Man-lpuri, Khichripur and Jaffarpur. It proposed to construct another four spitals of 100 beds each on the rephery of Delhi.

b) The following measures are posed to be taken:—

1) to integrate women in all development programmes like agri-

culture, rural development, animal husbandry, forestry, education, health, employment, science and technology so as to not merely give marginal benefits to them but to enable them to obtain an equal shar_e in the fruits of development and equal rights of access to the productive resources of the country;

- (2) to draw attention of the State Governments and the implementing agencies to the need for ensuring that women get their due share of benefits in development programmes; and
- (3) to expand supportive services for working women like women's hostels, creches and short-stay homes.

Kluimbalia-Salaya metre gauge line

(a) whether Government have received any representation from the State of Gujarat for the conversion of Khambalia-Salaya metre gauge branch line into B.G. line and for its extension up to the deep sea terminal port of Vadinar and to link this conversion to the Viramgam-Okha-Porbandar broad gauge conversion project now under construction; and

(b) by when the work of converting Hapa-Porbandar segment into broad gauge is expected to be completed?
