KHAN): (a) and (b) A report was published in the Magazine 'Probe' of February 1984 alleging that an officer was promoted without having minimum experience in the lower. grade. It has been ascertained from BHEL that no officer was promoted without completing the minimum experience in the lower grade.

Demand for take-over of the Jogigopa Paper Mill

- (a) whether Government have received any memorandum demanding the take-over of the Jogigopa Paper Mill in Assam;
- (b) if so, what is the Government's reaction to this demand; and
- (c) how many workers have been thrown out of employment and what is the production loss since the closuer of the Mill?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY AND COMPANY AFFAIRS AND HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI ARIF MOHD. KHAN): (a) Representations have been received for the revival and rehabilitation of Ashok Paper having two plants one at Jogighopa in Assam and the other at Ramesh-Nagar in Bihar.

- (b) The Central and State Governments and the Financial Institutions have been making efforts to rehabilitate Ashok Paper Mills with a view to resuming its operations.
- (c) The Jogighopa plant was employing about 1,582 persons. The installed capacity of the plant is 27,000

tonnes per annum. The loss in production of the plant cannot be estimated as the plant was working much below its capacity for a long time.

- (a) whether it is a fact that the tyre industry has incurred a net loss Rs. 60 crores, in a total turn over of Rs. 1600 crores;
- (b) whether it is also a fact that in an investment of Rs. 650 crores, the loss was 9.3 per cent;
- (c) whether it is a fact that recent increase in the tyre prices does not take into account the corresponding increase in cost between the 1981 and 1985; and
- (d) what remedial measures Government propose to take to help the tyre industry?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY AND COMPANY AFFAIRS AND HOME **AFFAIRS** (SHRI ARIF MOHD. KHAN): (a) and (b) According to the Industry, on a total production Rs. 1600 crores, it has incurred a loss of Rs. 60 crores or a negative profit of 9.3 per cent on an investment Rs. 649 crores during 1984. However, as published accounts of most of the tyre companies for the year 1984 are no yet available, the actual position cannot be verified.

(c) and (d) Indian tyre industry manufactures over two hundred varieties of tyres with about hundred tread natterns. Twre companies have revised prices of different tyres numufactured by them

different times. Further, the extent of increase in prices of different sizes of tyres varies from unit to unit as well as within the same uni**t. As** such, it is not possible to corelate directly the variations in tyre prices with changes in inputs costs. There is no control on prices or distribution of tyres, However, Government closely monitoring the prices of tyres as well as raw material inputs and frequently interacts with the tyre industry as well as raw material producers so as to ensure reasonable stability in the prices of both tyres and raw material inputs.
