The main functions of primary Health Centres/Sub-centres include the preventive and promotive health services through health education, maternal and child health and family planning education, motivation and provision of services for the family planning programme.

It is proposed to expand the existing health infrastructure during the 7th Plan period. The allocation for the 7th Five Year Plan for central health sector have, not yet been finalised.

**Admission of Scheduled Tribe students in the medical colleges under the Delhi University**

1956. SRI JERLIE E. TARIANG: Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) the names of students belonging to the Scheduled Tribes who have been selected for admission in the medical colleges under the Delhi University for M.B.B.S. course for the current year;

(b) the number of seats reserved in the above medical colleges for the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes during the current year, separately; and

(c) whether all the seats in the medical colleges reserved for the Scheduled Tribes by the Delhi University have been filled up?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION (SHRI K. C. PANT): (a) The list of candidates selected for admission to the medical course in Delhi has not yet been announced.

(b) The University has reserved 100 seats for Scheduled Castes and 100 seats for Scheduled Tribes, in the three medical colleges in Delhi. The total number of seats so reserved is 48.

(c) Does not arise as the admissions have not so far been finalised.

**Number of blind persons in the country**
