THF MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI JANARDHAN POOJARI): (a) and (b) A Statement is laid on the Table of the Hou e.

Statement

(a 1 and (b) The Reserve Bank of Indi' lias informed that the present data reporting system does not generate dis-trict-wise information on Differential Rate of Interest Scheme (DRI). However, according to the latest information available with Reserve Bank the total advances outstanding in the State of Gujarat under DRI were Rs. 42.62 crores in 3.70 lakh. borrowal accounts. Under DRI Scheme 'he banks have been asked to advance I per cent of their total advances outsanding at the end of previous year. This target i. bank-wise and there are no Statewise targets. However, in the State of Gujarat the advances tinder DRI as at the end of December 1983 constituted 2.2 per cent of the total outstanding advances as at the end of the previous year. The advances to Ihe members of Scheduled Castes nnd Scheduled Tribes were Rs. 29.39 crores, in 2.59 lakh borrowal accounts, amounting to 64 per cent of the total advances.

The banks will continue to provide loans under the Differential Rale of Interest Scheme to the eligible beneficiaries, including the members of the Scheduled (astes and Scheduled Tribes as per the target assigned by the Government.

(a) There has not been any slump in our exports lo the Gulf region, ln spite pf severe competition from the advanced countries, there has been an increase in

our exports to the Gulf region as will be evident from the following figures:

- (b) Among the several measures proposed 10 be taken 10 improve our export performance in the Gulf region, following are the more important ones: -
 - (i) A new export promotion and marketing strategy for Indian goods has been drawn up. Selected countii:s have been identified as thrirst markets for intensive export promolion efforts.
 - (ii) Similarly, thrust commodities/ product groups have been identified and special measures are proposed ;o promote Iheir exports,
 - liii) Possibilities of link deals invoking linkage of exports with imports, within the framework of '.he existing policy, are being explored.
 - (iv) Participation in Exhibitions in th se countries. Exclusive Indian exhibitions are being organised in Sand' Arabia and Qatar. In addition Indian Jewellery exhibition-cum-sale cue being feed in UAE and Kuwait.
 - (v) Special attention is being paid to promote project exports in the region.
 - (vi) Promotion of joint ventures between Indian and local parties in these countries.

SHR! C. HARIDAS: Sir: 1 want to know from the hon. Minister as lo what is the demand for the Indian goods in the Gulf. Has the Government received any complaints about the substandard quality of Indian goods?

SHRI P. A. SANGMA: Sir. the main items of exports from our country to the Gulf area have been tea. spices, fruits. vegetables and meal. And now we have aho started in a small way the export of engineering goods. There has been at one time a complaint about the quality
