to overcome some of the obstacles, which have prevented the advance, ment of women. For this purpose the Ministry is also having a dialogue with other related Ministries and voluntary agencies for taking action to overcome the obstacles.

Reintroduction of Passenger Train.

893. SHRI ADINARAYANA REDDY: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Railway Board has received any representation regarding the reintroduction of passenger train No,. 191 from Tirupati to Villeepuram; and

(b) if so, what action Government have taken in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI MADHAVRAO SCINDIA): (a) No, Sir, only representations regarding extension of 191 Katpadi-Pakala passenger to Tirupati have been received.

(b) Katpadi and Tirupati are already connected by 3 pairs of passenger and one pair of Express trains which are considered adecmate.

Train No. 642
