#### Courts' Martial of Army Personnel

# \*137. SHRI L. GANESAN: SHRI V. GOPALSAMY:

Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

- (a) what is the number of army jawans and officers who were court martialed during the last three years;
- (b) what is the number of those who were dismissed from service during the same period;
- (c) what is the number, out of them, of those who were connected with disturbances following the Operation Blue Star; and
- (d) whether there is any proposal to review each case, if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI P. V. NARASIMHA RAO): (a)

- and (b) A total of 5211 officers|JCOs|ORs were court martialled during the calendar years 1982, 1983 and 1984 in which form these figures are maintained. Out of these a total of 3170 were dismissed during the same period.
- (c) Nil, since disciplinary action in cases following Operation Blue Star began in 1985, and are still continuing.
- (d) Provision already exists for review of such cases under the Army Act and Army Instructions issued thereunder.

# Uneven Progress in Rural Electrification Programme in States

- \*138. SHRI KRISHNA KUMAR BIRLA: Will the Minister of IRRIGATION AND POWER be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that while the States of Punjab, Haryana, Kerala and Tamil Nadu have achieved almost 100 per cent of rural electrification, the States of Rajasthan, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal have failed to electrify 50 per cent of their villages;
- (b) if so, what are the reasons for this uneven progress; and
- (c) what steps the Central Government have taken to remove the constraints, if

any, and to effectively coordinate the activities of various agencies involved in the rural electrification programme for a balanced progress and to achieve the goal within a time-bound programme?

THE MINISTER OF IRRIGATION AND POWER (SHRI B. SHANKARA-NAND): (a) While Punjab, Haryana, Kerala and Tamil Nadu have achieved 100 per cent village electrification, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal have also electrified more than 50 per cent of their villages. Bihar has reached a level of 49.60 per cent in village electrification.

- (b) The main reasons of uneven development are
  - (i) differences in infrastructural development of States;
  - (ii) inadequate power availability and
    - (iii)problems of terrain.
- (c) The steps being taken to ameliorate the situation include provision of funds for Rural Electrification under the Minimum Needs Programme so as to reduce regio nal imbalances, closer monitoring of projects under implementation. Augmenta tion of generation capacity and closer co ordination between REC's Regional Offices and the SEBs in project formulation and implementation.

#### Steps to be taken by the State Governments to reduce power transmission losses

# \*139. DR. H. P. SHARMA: SHRI BHAGATRAM MANHAR:

Will the Minister of IRRIGATION AND POWER be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the Stat; Governments have been urged to take effective steps to reduce power transmission losses which stood at more than 20 per cent;
- (b) if so, what specific measures. if any, were suggested to them: and
- (c) what is the response of the various State Government thereto?

THE MINISTER OF IRRIGATION AND POWER (SHRI B. SHANKARA-NAND): (a) Yes, Sir.

  - (i) improvements of sub-transmission and distribution systems;
- (ii) reduction of lengths of Low Tension distribution lines and rovement of power factors; and
  - (iii) closer supervision and frequent inspections to reduce and eliminate pilferage of energy, and award deterrent punishment in cases detected.
- (c) State Governments realise the im portance of these measures and are adopt ing them.

THE MINISTER OF RAILWAYS (SHRI BANSI LAL): (a) and (b) Construction of a second M.G. line from Tarri-baram to Chengalpattu (30.7 Kms.) has been approved in the Railway Budget 1985-86. There is no proposal at present for doubling of the action from Chengalpattu to Villupuram.
