Gov-Report from the Maharashtra ernment on Communal Riots in Bhiwandi

KISHORE 454. SHRI NAND BHATT: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Central Government have received any report from the Maharashtra Government on the communal riots which took place in Ehiwandi recently; and
- (b) if so, what are the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRIMATI RAM DULARI SINHA). (a) and (b) The Central Government has received the report on communal riots witnessed in Bhiwandi during May, 1984. As per this report communal trouble started because of the provocative speeches made the Shiva Sena leader and distorted version of alleged abuse against Prophet Mohammad carried in certain language papers. In this riot, Bhiwandi alone 109 persons were killed and 217 persons were injured. 972 persons were arrested during this riot, in Bhiwandi alone. Immediately after the riot broke, the State Government took all possible curb the riot in Bhiwandi. Relief centres for riot victims were opened. The following .ex-gratia payments were made to the riot victims.

- killed: (i) Next of kin of those Rs 5000.
- (ii) Those seriously injured: Rs. 2,000.
- (iii) Other injured persons: 1000. Further, the Government of Maharashtra have provided financial assistance for repairs/reconstruction of houses in Bhiwandi.

Price Hike of Steel

- (a) whether it is a fact that Goverament have increased the prices of steel by 15 per cent recently;
- (b) if so, what are the reasons therefor: and
- (c) how far it is likely to affect the common man and the small scale industries in the country?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN MINISTRY OF STEEL AND MINES (SHRI N. K. P. SALVE): (a) to (c) Due to escalations in costs of production and to provide assistance to the Engineering Goods Exporters, the Joint Plant Committee of main producers of iron and steel had announced on June 21, 1984 an average increase of 15 per cent in the prices of iron and steel. The price increase in respect of items commonly used, such as, bars and rods and . GP/GC sheets has been less even 10 per cent as against the average increase of about 15 per cent. Impact of the increase in price iron and steel on the economy is expected to be marginal.
