

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY (SHRI PATTABHI RAMA RAO): (a) and (b) Indian tyre industry manufacture with about five hundred tread patterns. The prices of tyres differ from company to company. Different tyre companies have revised the prices of various types of tyres manufactured by them at different times during the last three years. According to the manufacturers, they have been forced to raise the prices of tyres, mainly due to increase in raw materials and conversion costs.

(c) Tyres are not subject to any price or distribution control. A close watch is however, maintained by the Government over prices of tyres as well as their raw materials.

(c) what progress has been made to bifurcate it into two separate units—one under ITDC and the other for producing insulators; and

(d) whether Government propose to replace the top personnel of the Company in view of their direct involvement in massive fraud and conspiracy to cheat the Punjab National Bank and subsequent arrests in July, 1984 and misuse of the money of the Bengal Potteries Limited and, if not, the reasons therefor?

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
