 - -Introduction of incentive scheme.

Threat of Meningitis and Malaria *to* widows of November riots housed in Tilak Vihar in Delhi

743. SHRI YALLA SESI BHU-SHANA RAO: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that there i_s a serious threat of meningitis and malaria to the widows of recent riots now housed in Tilak Vihar as reported in Times of India on the 1st April, 1985 and if so, what remedial steps have been taken/are proposed to be taken;
- (b) whether it is a fact that the Indian Medical Research and Development scientists have been working for decades on preventive vaccines/ sera for various diseases including

malaria and meningitis and if so, the details of the achievements and expenditure incurred thereon;

- (c) whether meningitis vaccine now imported more effectively manufactured in various old established institutes in the country some of which have been in existence for nearly a century and are employing foreign qualified researchers; and
- (d; whether Government propose to revamp and reorganise these research institutions?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH YOGENDRA (SHRI MAKWANA): (a) No, Sir. However Medical Teams visiting are the area and giving Chemprophylaxis with Sulphadiazin tablets to all suffering from throat/fever in the area. As a health education measure pamphlets do's and dont's in respect of menin gitis have been distributed to all the families. Anti-malaria measures also been intensified. Fogging regular rations. anti-larval measures and focal spray with Pyrethrurn are being undertaken in these areas. Weekly surveillance is being done the area to detect malaria cases in the community.

(b) and (c) The country today is self sufficient in the production of a number of vaccines, including vaccines require^ for the expanded programme of immunization. While some progress has been achieved in the field of development of an anti malaria vaccine, it has not yet reached a level of production and introduction in the national programme.

Taking up a programme for the research and development of the technology of production of pure poly-sacharide antigens including menin-gococal vaccine as a pilot project is under consideration.
