

(e) what is Government's action thereon?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI CHANDULAL CHANDRAKAR): (a) Farmer membership of Dairy Cooperative Societies increased during 1984 over the year 1983 in Tamil Nadu and Punjab. The procurement of milk during flush period also increased in Punjab. There was however less procurement of milk in Tamil Nadu during winter of 1984.

(b) and (c) A statement indicating the quantity of milk procured, marketed per day and the total quantity of milk powder including Infant milk food manufactured by the respective cooperative Dairy Federation during the months of February, October and December, 1984 in the States of Tamil Nadu, Punjab and Gujarat is enclosed (Annexure).

The details of the funds requirement and provisional funds released under Operation Flood II during 6th Plan per-

iod to the three States are as under:—

#### Cattle Breeding

1124. SHRI SHANTIMOY GHOSH. Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether the cattle breeding research project aiming to evolve technology for rapid and stable improvement of dairy

cattle in India has a time bound programme;

(b) if so, the location of research centres, targets set for each centre and achievements during 1984-85;

(c) what animals, genetic groupwise, age-wise and sex-wise existed as on the

1st April, 1985 at each centre and corresponding numbers targetted;

(d) the number of milch cows alive and daily milk production centrewise and how it differs from similar cattle at National Dairy Institute, Karnal; and

(e) the time by when Government propose to attain self-sufficiency in milk production through training of breeding technology?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT: (SHRI CHANDULAL CHANDRAKAR): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The All India Coordinated Research Project on Cattle is at present located at the Indian Veterinary Research Institute, Izatnagar, Haryana Agricultural University, Hissar, Jawahar Lal Nehru Krishi Vishwa Vidyalaya, Jabalpur, Mahatma Phule Krishi Vidya Peeth, Rahuri and Andhra Pradesh Agricultural University, Lam. The targets were set for production of different halfbred and 3/4 crossbred genetic groups and testing their performance, which have been achieved at all the centres within the limitation of the infrastructural facilities available. Since it is a long term project for evolving new breed (s) of cows suitable for different agroecological conditions, no year-wise targets have been fixed or achievements assessed.

(c) to (e) The information is being collected and will be placed on the Table of the House in due course.

**Artificial insemination programme as conducted by the dairy cooperative during the Sixth Five Years Plan period**

(b) the number of the calves born under the above programme, State-wise and year-wise during the Sixth Plan;

(c) whether percentages of dairy co-operative societies providing artificial insemination facilities has been decreasing in successive years of the Sixth Five Year Plan and if so, the details thereof; and

(d) what was Jha Committee's finding about these aspects under Operation Flood II programme and remedial steps recommended by the Committee in this regard?

(c) the number of flats that were constructed, the number of flats allotted as on 31st March, 1985, the number of persons who are still awaiting allotment, by every registered person is likely to receive allotment order;

(d) whether it is a fact that DDA did not inform those who were registered for flats about the delay in the construction of flats, but went on collecting instalments, and

(e) whether Government propose to hold an enquiry in this regard, if not, what are the reasons therefor?
