Labour going to foreign countries for seeking jobs

1115. SHRI RAMANAND YADAV:
SHRI DHULESHWAR
MEENA:

Will the Minister of LABOUR be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that large number of Indians have gone to foreign countries to seek jobs and they are sending large sums of foreign exchange to this country;

(b) if so, the number of jobless Indian workers who were permitted to go to foreign countries during 1983-84, 1984-85; and

(c) whether Government propose to bring forward a comprehensive legislation for the welfare of immigrant labour and introduce compulsory insurance scheme and create welfare funds?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR (SHRI T. ANJIAH): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The number of Indian workers permitted to go to the foreign countries during the calendar years 1983 and 1984 is approximately 2,25,000 and 2,05,900 respectively.

(c) The modalities of the introduction of the compulsory insurance scheme and creation of welfare fund for emigrant workers are being worked out in consultation with the concerned agencies.

THE MINISTER OF WORKS AND HOUSING (SHRI ABDUL GHAFOR):

(a) The amounts of loan sanctioned by HUDCO to different States/Union Territories during the last three years are given in the annexure.

(b) The number of agencies which have received the loan during the last three years is also given in the annexure. The schemes are sanctioned in accordance with the prescribed guidelines.

(c) HUDCO itself monitors the implementation of the scheme through periodical reports from the implementing agencies.
