REFERENCE TO THE LONG-STANDING DEMANDS OF PEOPLE OF TRIPURA

SHRIMATI ILA BHATTACHARYA (Tripura): Madam, I thank you for giving me a chance to raise an important issue about Tripura.

Madam, the youths and students in Tripura have courted arrest on 17th May, 1985 to draw the attention of the Centre to the legitimate and long-standing demands of the people of Tripura where 80 per cent of the population are under the poverty line. Because of the extreme backwardness of Tripura due to lack of infrastructural facilities like railways, road communication, etc. the people of Tripura are suffering much. Only 12 kilometres of railway lines have been laid in Tripura so far. No sincere effort has been made to set up medium

or large-scale industries there. The demand for the setting up of a paper mill, a second jute mill and gas-based industries in Tripura which has been raised time and again has been rejected. Even diesel is not provided in sufficient quantity, as Tripura is totally dependent on diesel. I, therefore, urge the Government to fulfil the following demands of the people of Tripura:

(1) The railway line should be extended from Dharmanagar to Sabroom via Agartala.

(2) Setting up a paper mill and a second jute mill.

(3) Immediate establishment of gas-based industries in Tripura.

(4) For the upliftment of the condition of the tribals, more funds should be provide to the Autonomous District Council

(5) More funds should be given to the State for sanctioning of unemployment allowance to the unemployed youths, and for the development of the State.

REFERENCE TO THE DEMAND FOR CENTRAL ASSISTANCE TO ORISSA TO OVERCOME DAMAGES CAUSED BY RECENT NATURAL CALAMITY

SHRI AKSHAY PANDA (Orissa): Madam Deputy Chairman, I want to draw the attention of the Government of India through you, Madam, that it is a matter of deep concern that natural calamities like tornado, cyclone and storm have caused heavy damage in the districts of Sambalpur, Cuttack, Balasore and Keonjar of Orissa during the last 15 to 20 days. In Sambalpur there has been a colossal loss of human life and cattle and animals, and a very large scale damage to the dwelling houses of the public and public institutions also heavy damage

has also been caused to paddy and rabi crops. The State is presently passing through several drought conditions since September, 1984 as there has been no rain. The Chief Minister has also visited the affected areas and the State Government has given some help to the needy persons. But it is not sufficient. The calamity is of such a nature that help from the Government of India is badly needed. In these circumstances, I would request the Government of India, through you, Madam, that a central team should immediately be deputed to visit the spot and assess the loss and help the State Government.

REFERENCE TO THE ACTIVITIES OF EXTREMIST GROUP IN NORTH- EASERN REGION

QUE (Assam):** Madam Deputy Chair-
man, I rise to mention some disturb-
ing developments in the north-eastern
region. As reported in the press,
various extremist groups in the north-
eastern region have reportedly agreed
recently to coordinate their activities
to achieve a "separate autonomous
region" under the so-called "Brachin
Plan" which envisages formation of a
union encompassing the whole of Na-
galand, Manipur, Mizoram, Arunachal
Pradesh, Meghalaya, the tribal-domi-
nated parts of Tripura, large parts of
Assam and Bangladesh's Chittagong
hill tracts dominated by tribal
population. This, they claim, is
a new thesis shifting their
demand from complete secession ad-
vocated by these various groups
earlier. The new thesis envisages a
separate North-Eastern Region en-
joying extensive self-autonomy and
only accepting the "tutelage of the
India State in select spheres like
Defence and External Affairs." This
reported new move is just another
ruse to continue to destabilise the re-
gion in still another form. Finding a

complete secession. which they advocated earlier, rejected by the people they now hit upon a new strategy to do the bidding of some foreign powers which are out to destabilise the region. The very proposal to include a part of a foreign territory like Bangladesh perhaps indicates their intentions. They have reportedly given a fresh call to the people to resort to armed struggle against the Government of India till their demands are met. Against the backdrop of Khalistan movement and the Anandpur Sahib resolution and in the wake of fresh spurt of terrorist activities all around at the moment, this new move acquires a significant note. It appears that there are some attempts on their part to establish contacts and coordination with Punjab extremists. The Government must tighten the law and order machinery and launch a vigorous campaign involving the local indigenous, people to bring home to the people of the region that this new move is just a camouflage to their continued terrorist activities.

**REFERENCE TO THE MURDER OF
5 CPI WORKERS BY A TERRORIST
GANG IN BIHAR**

Madam Deputy Chairman. I rise to draw the attention of the House to a shocking incident of ghastly murder of five workers of the Communist Party of India by a gang of terrorists operating in Bihar. According to the information supplied by a group of Communist leaders who visited the place of the incident, 7 persons were killed on 14th May at 7.30 p.m. outside the office of the Communist Party of India at tea shop where they were sitting. The names of the persons killed are: Jagdish Prasad, Secretary of the Anchal party, unit and mukhia of the gram.
