Kankahi Irrigation Project

1117. SHRI RAFIQUE ALAM: Will the Minister of IRRIGATION AND POWER be pleased to state:

(a) whether the survey of the Kankahi Irrigation Project in Bihar has been completed;

(b) if so, the details thereof; and

(c) to what extent this project is likely to help in controlling floods?

THE MINISTER OF IRRIGATION AND POWER (SHRI B. SHANKARANAND): (a) and (b) Bihar Government has completed some of the essential surveys and submitted a Project Report on Western Kankahi Irrigation Scheme with an irrigation potential of about 80 thousand hectares at an estimated cost of Rs. 74.20 crores

to Central Water Commission in November 1984 for techno-economic clearance and obtaining approval of the Planning Commission.

(c) The Flood Control portion of the Scheme has not yet been submitted by the State.
