(c) This aspect can be considered as toon as the quality, quantity and price of ihe indigenous products meet the national requirement.

## Modification of Freight Initialisation Policy

1214. SHRI NIRMAL CHATTERJEE: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Cotton Textile and the Chemicals and Pharmaceulicals industry of West Bengal are on the verge of extinction  $du_e$  to the Central Government's freight equalisation policy;

(b) whether the said policy is applicable only to tiie raw materials moving out of West Bengaj 'ike coal" and iro<sub>n</sub> and not for the incoming raw materials for the cotton, chemicals and pharmaceutical industries in West Bengal;

(c) if so, the reasons therefor; and

(ei) whether Government propose to modify policy in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING (SHRI K. R. NARAYANAN): (a) to (d) It  $i_s$  diffi-i lift to attribute the development or decline of ao industry in any particular Slate to frei\$st equalisation.

The Freight Equalisation Policy was reviewed some time back by the National Transport Policy Committee (Pande Committee). The Committee expressed its views against extending the Freight Equalisation Scheme to other commodities and recommended that even the existing schemes of freight equalisation on industrial commodifies like steel and central be phased out. The Government have already accepted the recommendations made by this Committee, subject to subsidisation of transport to remote, inaccessible and isolated areas.

## Central investment in each State

1215. SHRI DIPEN GHOSH: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state whelher Government propose to enhance the Central investment to those States where they are insignificant?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING (SHRI K. R. NARAYANAN): Plan investment by the Cenire covers a wide range of both infrastructural and social welfare services as well as investment in public sector projects and units. The former are decided On national requirements while the latter are decided on techno-economic and other considerations.

However, special category States have their Plan outlays financed in large measure hy Centrai assistance as one of the methods of reducing regional disparities.
