

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI JANARDHAN POOJARI): (a) and (b) There have been reports regarding shortage of coins and currency notes of small denominations. The gap in demand and supply of coins and currency notes has been due to capacity constraints of the Mints and Currency and Bank Note Presses.

(c) Government have taken various steps to meet the demand of coins and currency notes. Incentive schemes along with the increased working hours have been introduced in all the three Mints, i.e. Bombay Calcutta and Hyderabad and two Currency Note Presses at Nasik Road and Dewas. As part of modernisation and expansion scheme, twenty-two new coining presses are being procured for the three Mints and two production lines at Currency Note Press, Nasik Road and balancing equipments for the Bank Note Press, Dewas are being installed. It has also been decided to establish a new Mint and a Note Press and steps are being taken to implement this decision, beginning 1985-86.
