Amount spent on Shere Kashmir Medical Institute, Srinagar

303. SHRI GHULAM RASOOL KAR: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) what is the amount of money so tar spent by the Central Government on Shere Kashmir Medical Institute, Srinagar;
- (b) what is the amount of allocation made in the Seventh Five Year Plan;
- (c) what ar_e the recommendations and Kashmir made by the Jammu for Seventh Five Government the Year Plan; and
- (d) whether the Central Govern ment propose to fulfil the require ments of this Institute?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH (SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA): (a) to (d) The Central Government did not provide any funds for the Shere Kashmir Medical Institute. As per information furnished by the State Government, the expenditure incurred on the Institute from the J & K State Plan is as follows:—

Transportation of fruits from Kashmir to Delhi

- (a) whether it is a fact that as a result of non-availability of transport facilities and high charges demanded by transporters in the Kashmir valley a huge quantity of fruits get rotten every year;
- (b) whether Government propose to start a new zonal permit system for transporting fruits from Kashmir to Delhi and issue the permits to the fruit growers and dealers only; and
 - (c) if not, what are the reasons therefor?

(c) The extension of the line from CJdhampur to Srinagar can be considered only when the Jammu. Udhampur New Line is nearing completion, subject to availability of resources.

Blocking of Jammu Srinagar Highway

306. SHRI GHULAM RASOOL KAR: Will the Minister of SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT be pleased to state:

- (a) how many times in the last three years the Jammu and Srinagar Highway got blocked;
- (b) the number of passengers who were stranded;
- (c) the number of them who died as a result thereof;
- (d) whether any compensation was given for the dead and what arrangements were made for the stay of the stranded persons;
- (e) whether there is any proposal under Government's consideration *for* a better alternative route to the valley; and
- (f) wheher any survey has been done in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF •CHE MINISTRY OF SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT (SHRI Z. R. ANSARI): (a) to (f) During 1982—84, Jammu-farinagar Highway was blocked nine times. Information regarding number of passengers stranded, number of passengers who died, if any, and the compensation paid to them is *t* not maintained by the Government of India. At present there is no proposal to provide on alternative National Highway route to the valley.

Sethusamundram Project

- 307. SHRI V. GOPALSAMY; Will the Minister of SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT be pleased to state:
- (a) whether any study in the past was conducted on the Sethusamund-xam Project;

- (b) if so, the details thereof and the steps taken to implement the same;
- (c) wheher Government propose to conduct any study on this project during ie Seventh Five Year Plan period; roid
 - (d) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT (SHRI Z. R. ANSARI): (a) Yes.

- (b) The Report of the Expert Committee set up to examine the economic viability of the Sethusamudram Canal Project has been received by the Government. The Committee has observed that the economic viability of the Project is not amenable to exact quantification since certain factors, relevant to the Project's assessment, are based on a number of probabilities. The cost of the Project has been estimated at Rs. 282 crores with reference to February, 1983 prices. The Committee has also found that the Project might yield a return varying from 4.72 per cent to 11.93 per cent under different sets of assumptions. The Committee did not find it possible to quantify the indirect economic benefits to the country and the social benefits which the Project could confer. The internal rate of return with reference to the Project's estimated cost has been considered rather low. The Committee has recommended that the Project could be implemented in view of other considerations, and for making the Project financially and economically concessions like treating the investment on the Project as a grant, etc. could be txtended. No decision on the report has been taken.
