631. SHRI RAMSINGHBHAI PATA-LIYABHAI RATHVAKOLI: Will the Minister of FOOD AND CIVIL SUPPLIES be pleased to state;

(a) whether the Government of Gujarat urged the Central Govern ment in 1984 to increase it<sub>s</sub> quota of rationed items like palm and rapeseed oil;

(t>) if so, the details of such demand;

(c) the action taken thereon and the quantity of the above items given to Gujarat during that period; and

(d) what steps are being taken to increase the supply of these items to Gujarat?

THE MINISTER OF FOOD AND CTVIL SUPPLIES (RAO BIRENDRA SINGH): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The Government of Gujarat had demanded an enhanced allocation of 11,500 Mts. of Palmolein per month for July, September and October,

(c) and (d) The following monthly allocation of Palmolein and Sunflower oil was made to Gujarat: —

The quantity of imported edible oil allocated is meant to supplement the local availability of edible oils and is not intended to meet in the full demand of the State Government Gujarat being a majoroil producing State, the allocation of imported edible oils alter lymade to it is considered adequate.

## Unsold wheat seeds of high yielding varieties

632. SHRI BHUVNESH CHATUR-VEDI: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased'to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that huge stocks of wheat seeds of high yielding varieties are lying unsold with the National Seeds Corporation and its State units;

(b) if so, what is the total stock lying with the Corporation;

(c) what are the reasons for such huge stocks remaining unsold; *and* 

(d) whether Government propose to sell the stock?

THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI BUTA SINGH): (a) and (b) National Seeds Corporation of India are *to* maintain a buffer stock of 70,000 quintals of certified wheat seeds. They have with them a stock of 1 lakh quintals.

(c) The reasons for carrying additional 30,000 quintals over and above the quantity to be maintained as buffer stock are as follows:

(i) Due to drought/inadequate rainfall during Kharif 1984 a portion <\f the wheat area in Maharashtra, Rajasthan, etc., has been diverted to ther crop which require less water.

(ii) The dislocation in the road transportation during first 15 days of Nrvember, 1984, which is the crucial period for movement of wheat seeds also affected the delivery in right time and consequently shortfall in consumption.

(iii) Some of the State Governments and State Agencies did not lift the committed quantities of wheat seeds.
