Reflations with Neighbouring Coun-tries

784. SHRI CHATURANAN MISHRA: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state;

(a) whether it is a fact that our relations with neighbouring countries like Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh and Nepal are not as good as these ought to have been and there is a feeling in those countries that India is behaving like a big brother;

(b) whether Government propose to take any fresh measures to remove such feeling and offer a collective security and friendship pact with our neighbours on the basis of no have to any foreign power?

THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI P. V. NARASIMHA RAO) (a) While relations with other countries, including neighbours, could always be improved, Government do not agree with the assessment contained in (a). From time to time, problems do arise but it is India's policy to resolve all differences in an amicable manner through bilateral discussions. There is no intention or desire on the part of India to behave like a big brother.

(b) India and our neighbours belong to the Non-aligned Movement which provides a framework for cooperation and friendship between member States and precludes the establishment of foreign bases.

Study of Sensitive Defence Zones in the Sub-Continent by U.S.

(a) whether it is a fact that a top secret U.S. task force has undertaken study and assessment of the various

sensitive defence zones in the sub-continent during the period from November, 1983 to January, 1984; and

(b) if so, what are the details in this regard and the action Government propose to take in the matter?

(c) whether Government propose to hand over these requisitioned flats to C.P.W.D. for proper maintenance and deduct the expenses from the rent due to the landlords; and

(d) what steps Government have recently taken to persuade the landlords for minimum maintenance like ceiling leakages, protection of electrical wiring etc.?
