Export Advisory Panel

Decline of tourist trade to hill stations

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn that there has been decline of tourists to the hill resorts

in the country due to lack of water, rest houses and proper transport facilities for comestic middle class tourists; and

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF TOURISM AND CIVIL (SHRI KHURSHEED AVIATION ALAM KHAN): (a) and (b) The Central Department of Tourism does not maintain statistical information domestic tourist traffic to tourist centres, including hill resorts. Further, no specific case has brought to the attention of the Department of Tourism regarding the decline of tourist traffic to, a hill resort account of lack of water, rest houses and proper transport facilities domestic middle class tourists.

Development of tourist facilities in the hills as well as in the plains, for domestic tourists is primarily the responsibility of the State Governments. The Central Department of Tourism, however, supplements the efforts the State Governments in the development of facilities at tourist centres of national and/or international importance, subject to availability of funds and inter se priority.
