- (a) the aims and objectives of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC);
- (b) whether it is a fact that NAAC would give rating to various institutions in the country;
- (c) if so, the guidelines/norms followed by NAAC before giving rating to institutions;
- (d) whether it is a fact that NAAC has also given grades to some of the institutions to which Government has given Deemed University status; and
- (e) if so, the details of the institutions for which grades have been given by NAAC, State-wise?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI D. PURANDESWARI): (a) The objectives of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), as envisaged in its Memorandum of Association, are to assess and accredit institutions of higher learning, universities and colleges of one or more of their units, *i.e.* departments, schools institutions, programmes, etc.

(b) and (c) The competent authorities of NAAC, *viz.* Executive Committee and the General Council have not yet decided to give rating to higher educational institutions in the country.

(d) and (e) Yes, Sir. The State-wise details of 47 'Deemed to be Universities' who have been assessed and accredited by NAAC are given in the Statement.
