THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF STATISTICS AND PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTATION (SHRI SRIPRAKASH JAISWAL): (a) to (d) As on December, 2009, out of 950 central sector projects costing Rs. 20 crore and above under implementation, 495 projects were delayed. During the period 2004-05 to 2009-10 (as in December, 2009), 601 projects were completed including 54 projects completed on time/ahead of schedule. Detailed break-up of these projects, Ministry-wise/Sector-wise are given in Statement.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF TRIBAL AFFAIRS (SHRI TUSHAR BHAI CHAUDHARY): (a) There are 5 tribes in Andaman and Nicobar Islands namely Great Andamanese, Onge, Sentinelese, Shom Pen, Jarawa whose populations are less than 500. They may be considered to be facing the threat of extinction.
