The terms of reference of the Committee will be as follows:

- (a) To examine the principles involved in a possible shift in using the banking and investment financing systems for achieving socially desirable results in this respect in our policy from physical controls to financial controls with a view to streamlining the control system and improving its efficiency; and
- (b) Any other matter which may be relevant to the consideration of (a).

The Committee will submit its report by November 30, 1984.

Smelyakov, Deputy Minister of Foreign Trade of the USSR, visited on 2nd February, 1984, with the objective of promoting exports of Soviet machinery and equipment and transfer of technology to India. The delegation held discussion in this connection with the concerned Government Departments as well as public and private sector enterprises. It is not possible to indicate the outcome discussions but larger imports Soviet machinery and equipment by India are expected to take place in the due course.
