However, a 5-member delegation of the Pan Africanist Congress (PAC) of Azania, headed by its Chairman Mr. J. N. Pokela visited India from January 5 to 9, 1984. Other Members of the delegation included Ahmed Gora Ibrahim, Joseph Mkwanazi, Thobile Gola and Nomvo Booi (all Central Committee members of PAC). Matters of mutual interest were discussed with officials of the Ministry of External Affairs, and the delegation also paid a courtesy call on the Minister of Labour.
