

(b) what are the reasons for delay in the bifurcation of the above circle; and

(c) whether a separate P&T Circle for Assam and Arunachal with headquarters at Gauhati is being created and if so, by when?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI VIJAY N PATIL): (a) No, Sir. It is not correct to hold that the north eastern circle is functioning unsatisfactorily.

(b) and (c) The P&T Circle for North-Eastern Region already stands bifurcated into Separate Postal Circle and Telecom. Circle from 1974 itself. The question of further bifurcation of Telecom. Circle was however, considered during the year 1979 and 1980 and it was decided to put off the matter due to administrative reasons, from August, 1981, the N.E. Postal Circle was bifurcated into two postal circles viz. Assam and Meghalaya circle with headquarters at Shillong with jurisdiction over the States of Assam and Meghalaya and N.E. circle with headquarters at Imphal having jurisdiction over the States of Manipur, Nagaland, Tripura and Union Territories of Arunachal Pradesh and Mizoram on a tentative basis. A post of Additional Postmaster General for N.E. Circle in the Sr. Administrative Grade of IPS was re-designated as Postmaster-General, N.E. Postal Circle with headquarters at Imphal, following this re-organisation, the department in order to accelerate the tempo of development activities in these areas, upgraded 5 posts of Superintendent of Post Offices to the status of Directors of Postal Services in the States of Tripura, Nagaland and Manipur and in the Union Territories of Mizoram and Arunachal Pradesh. In this context, it was held that there was no necessity for having 2 separate Postal Circle- for 'NE. Region and that there should be one composite circle with Headquarters at Shillong as before for integrated development of Postal Services in N.E. Region. It was, therefore, decided in May, 1982 to re-unify the Postal Circles into

one. The PMG, N.E. with headquarters at Imphal was re-designated as Additional Postmaster General, N.E. Circle. The headquarters of the Additional PMG at Shillong.

Import of LPG Cylinders from, Brazil

1524. PROP. B. RAMACHANDRA RAO: Will the Minister of ENERGY be pleased to state:

(a) the number of LPG cylinders proposed to be imported from Brazil and their total cost;

(b) the use of companies manufacturing LPG cylinders and the expected total production during the current and the next financial year;

(c) the number of companies which have been given new licences for manufacturing of LPG cylinders during the current year 1983-84;

(d) by when these companies are expected to start production;

(e) what steps are being taken to increase the production in case the installed capacity of all the licensed manufacturers is not adequate; and

(f) whether there is a proposal to manufacture smaller size LPG cylinders?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PETROLEUM IN THE MINISTRY OF ENERGY (SHRI GARGI SHANKAR MISHRA): (a) 8 lakhs cylinders are being imported from Brazil at the cost of about 12.81 crores.

(b) The list of the LPG cylinders manufacturing units is given in the enclosed statement. The expected total production of LPG cylinders during 1983-84 is around 30 lakhs and during 1984-85 is around 45-50 lakhs.

(c) No licence is required for establishment of LPG cylinder unit. During April-December 83* 391 units have been registered with D.G.T.D.

(d) Some of these units are reported to be in the process of setting up their factories and it is not possible to

indicate at this stage the time frame within which they will commence production.

(e) The present installed capacity is adequate to meet the demand of LPG cylinders of the oil industry;

(f) Test marketing of LPG mini cylinders has been taken up in Goa. Depending upon the outcome of the test marketing a final decision will be taken regarding production of mini cylinders.
