

Central Assistance to Kerala for Drought Relief

510. SHRI T. BASHEER: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have since received the report from the Central team which visited Kerala to assess the loss and damage caused by the drought in the State this year;

(b) if so, what are the details of the report;

(c) whether Government have taken any decision regarding Central assistance to Kerala; and

(d) if so, what are the details of amount proposed to be given?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI ARIF MOHD. KHAN):

(a) to (d) Central Team had visited the State of Kerala from 21st to 25th April, 1983 to study the drought situation. On the recommendations of the Central Team and its consideration by the High Level Committee, a ceiling of Central assistance of Rs. 33.77 crores was sanctioned. A further ceiling of Rs. 5.69 crores was sanctioned to the State for drought relief in the month of October, 1983. The State was also sanctioned a ceiling of assistance of Rs. 1 crore, besides a series of measures of rehabilitation and rejuvenation of commercial crops.
