(c) From 1980-81 uptil now 96.78 lakh beneficiaries have been assisted under the programme. Bringing above the poverty line is a gradual continuing process, and it will take time before the impact of the programme on beneficiary families is available.

- (d) According to the guidelines issued by the Government of India, all local M.Ps and MLAs are to be members of the governing body of District Rural Development Agencies which are in charge of the implementation of the programme.
- (e) Rural development programmes are implemented by the State Governments with the Central Government issuing guidelines from time to time for their proper implementation. The progress is monitored by obtaining periodic statistical from the State Governments, sending Central Teams for field visits and calling upon the State Governments, wherever necessary, to improve the pace and quality of implementation. Apart from the funds for the programme, the State Governments have been assisted to set up monitoring cells at the State Headquarters and to strengthen the District/Block machinery for better implementation.
