

(c) Rice and wheat are already being supplied through fair price shops. According to Delhi Administration, there is no proposal to sell pulses and vegetables through fair price shops. However, these articles are being sold through a large number of retail outlets (including mobile vans) of NAFED. Super Bazar, Kendriya Bhandar and Delhi State Civil Supplies Corporation.

Shortage of wagons

Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) the steps Government propose to take to solve the shortage of wagons in the next two years;

(b) the number of wagons manufactured in the last three years in various factories under the control of Railways; and

(c) what is the requirement of wagons and how many of them have been manufactured during the Sixth Five Year Plan and what is the target yet to be achieved during the same plan period?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE
MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI C. K.
JAFFAR SHARIEF): (a) The wagon

fleet is adequate for the present level of traffic.

(b) There are no wagon building factories under the control of Ministry of Railways as such. However, some wagons are manufactured in Railway Workshops. There are 10 wagon Building Units in the Country undertaking manufacture of wagons—Six in public sector and four under the private sector. The total number of wagons manufactured in the last three years is as under:

Industry	39,783
Railway Workshops	3,731

(c) The Sixth Plan proposed acquisition of 1,00,000 wagons, and in the mid-term review, it has been scaled down to 77,000.

It is expected that in the first four years of the Sixth Plan nearly 60,000 wagons will be acquired.

Foodgrains and sugar allotment to Andhra Pradesh for public distribution system

3154. SHRI RAYAPATI SAMBA SIVA RAO: Will the Minister of FOOD AND CIVIL SUPPLIES be pleased to state:

(a) the quantum of foodgrains and sugar allotted to Andhra Pradesh under public distribution system during the current financial year;

(b) whether the Central Government have received any request from the State Government for the enhancement of food-grain quota;

(c) if so, what are the details thereof; and

(d) what action the Central Government have taken thereon?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE DEPARTMENT OF ELECTRONICS AND IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD AND CIVIL SUPPLIES (SHRI M. S. SANJEEVI RAO): (a) A quantity of 10,15,000 tonnes of rice, 2,10,000 tonnes of wheat and 2,36,125 tonnes of sugar has been allotted to the Government of Andhra Pradesh for public distribution system during the period from April, 1983, to January, 1984, in the current financial year.

(b) to (d) Yes, Sir. The Government of Andhra Pradesh requested for an additional allotment of 70,000 tonnes of rice besides the normal monthly allocation of 1,29,000 tonnes for October, 1983, and also requested for raising the monthly allocation of rice to 2,00,000 tonnes each for the months of November and December, 1983 from the Central Pool because of the damage caused to the crops by rains and floods and consequential delayed arrival of crops in the market.

Keeping in view the overall tight position of stocks of rice in the Central Pool, easy availability of rice in a surplus State like Andhra Pradesh and supplemental nature of the allocations from the Central Pool, it has not been possible to accede to the request of the State Government. Nevertheless, the State Government has been allotted a quantity of 83,000 tonnes of rice each for November and December, 1983, and January, 1984.
