Promotion of L.D.C's in the Delhi Administration

3261. SHRI MIRZA IRSHADBAIG AIYUBBAIG: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that some L.D.Cs. were recruited in 1978 by the Delhi Administration and the Central Government on the basis of competitive examination conducted by the Delhi Administration and the Staff Selection Commission;

(b) if so, the number of such L.D.Cs. appointed under the Delhi Administration and the Central Government;

(c) whether the L.D.Cs. appointed in the Ministry of Home Affairs in the year 1978 have since been promoted as U.D.Cs;

(d) whether it is a fact that the L.D.Cs recruited by the Delhi Administration in 1978 have not yet been promoted as UDCs; and

(e) if answer to part (d) above be in the affirmative what are the reasons therefor and what is the detailed procedure being followed by the Delhi Administration and the Central Government in the matter of promotion and the batches of LDCs recruited by Delhi Administration which have since been promoted and what is the position of LDCs recruited in the year 1978?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI P. VENKATASUBBAIAH): (a) to (e) On the basis of the examination conducted by the Staff Selection Commission, 207 persons had been appointed as L.D.Cs in

the Delhi Administration and 102 persons were appointed in the Ministry of Home Affairs. The persons appointed in the year 1978 under the Delhi Administration or in the Ministry of Home Affairs have yet not been promoted as Upper Division Clerks.

Buses for Delhi Police

(a) what is the number of buses which are with the Delhi Police;

(b) whether it is a fact that the Delhi Police has to hire buses from the D.T.C. and other private parties for carrying arrested persons;

(c) the total number of buses hired by the Delhi Police from the D.T.C. and other private parties during the last three years, year-wise and hire charges paid; and

(d) what steps have been taken by the Delhi Police to procure more buses and how many buses have been added to its fleet during these years?
