(viii) A demonstrative scheme on "Rain Water Harvesting and Artificial Recharge to Ground Water" is being implemented in 13 identified areas of the States of Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh and Tamil Nadu at a total cost of Rs. 12 crores during the year 2006-07.

(c) and (d) Central Ministries/Departments of Railways, Defence, Posts, Telecommunications, Central Public Works Department and National Highways Authority of India have been requested to provide roof top rain water harvesting structures in the buildings under their control. Accordingly, such roof top rain water harvesting structures have been provided in many Central Government buildings.

For repair, renovation and restoration of water bodies directly linked to agriculture, Rs.3.75 crore has been released to the State, of Rajasthan during 2005-06.

(c) Planning Commission, Government of India, has earmaked a sum of Rs.400.00 crore under Accelerated Irrigation Benefits Programme, 2006-07 for Irrigation Projects in Rajasthan. During the current year, proposals for Central Assistance have not received from the State Government.

(d) There is no centrally funded irrigation scheme in Rajasthan.
