GHANI KHAN (a) The maximum CHAUDHURI): permissible speed in any section Railway line is sanctioned in relation to the track structure (viz. rail section, sleeper density, ballast cushion, type of formation and their condition), grades, curves, strength of bridges. standard of signalling etc. It is also different for different types of rolling stock on the same section. The maximum permissible speed. therefore. varies from section to section and for different types of rolling stock and these are incorporated in Railways working time tables. The designed and maximum sanctioned speeds modern track, diesel and electric engines, modern coaches and roller bearing box wagons are given below:
