

391. SHRI DINESH GOSWAMI: SHRI BUOY KRISHNA HANDIQUE.

Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government are planning to develop four Regional Eye Institutes during 1983-84.
- (b) whether Government are aware that the Regional Institute of Calcutta is not in a position to cater to the vast needs of the States of North-Eastern Region and a Regional Institute of Opthalmology in the Region has hecome a matter of imperative urgency; and
- (c) whether Government propose to open a Regional Eye Institute in the North East Region?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY (SHRIMATT WELFARE MOHSINA KIDWAI): (a) to (c) The National Programme for the Control of Blindness provides for the establishment of 6 Regional Institutes of Opthalmology. Four of these Institutes have already been established including the one at Calcutta. The setting up of two more Institutes is being expedited. There are proposals to set up a few more Regional Institutes of Ophthalmology during the remaining period of the Sixth Five Year Plan, provided adequate resources are available. Should these proposals materials the requirements of the North-Eastern Region will be kept in view.

Involvement of voluntary organisations in Family Planning drive

392. SHRI SHYAM SUNDAR MOHAPATRA: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state whether voluntary organisations have been involved in States for family planning drive?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRIMATf MOHSINA KIDWAI); Family Planning is sought to be promoted on voluntary basis as a peoples movement. As a result of the various initiatives taken, there has been encouraging response anj a verv large number of voluntary organisations are involved in the Family Planning programme in the various States and Union Territories. The States have again been urged to associate the voluntary organisations more closely in the implementation, of the programme both at the State and' district levels so as to instill a senee of partnership in the voluntary organisations National in the promotion of this vital Programme.

The last Joint Conference of the Central Council of Health and Central Family Welfare Council held on 7—9 July, 1983, in their recommendations has also urged upon all the organisations and groups in the non-Government sector at all levels—National, State, District and Village to come forward i_n large numbers and take a bigger role in promoting this National Programme.

Edible oil supply to Orissa

- 393. SHRI GAYA CHAND BHUYAN: Will the Minister of FOOD AND CIVIL SUPPLIES be pleased to state: '
- (a) what steps have been taken for increasing the monthly quota for supply of edible oil to Orissa to 4000 M.Ts.; and
- (b) what are the reasons for inordinate delay in supply of edible oil by State Trading Corporation to Orissa?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD AND CIVIL SUPPLIES (SHRI BHAGWAT JHA AZAD): (a) Monthly allocations to the State Governments of imported edible oils for public distribution are made on the basis of various factors, such as availability of indigenous edible oils in the State/ Region, allocations made earlier and quan-

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tities lifted, agaiust them, availability of stocks with STC etc. The allocation to Orissa has been stepped up to 770 MTs *in* April, 1983 from 510 MTs in March, 1983. This has been further increased to 1030 MTs. in June and July, 1983.

(b) There has been no delay in the supply of Palmolein. However, there has been some delay recently in the supply of tinned Refined Rapeseed Oil to Orissa Government due to delays in berthing of Jhe Rapeseed Oil ship at Bombay port. STC has taken steps to supply to full allotted quantities to the State Government.

Supply of wheat and ric» t* Orisaa

394. SHRI GAYA CHAND BHUYAN: SHRI JAGADISH JANL

Will the Minister of FOOD AND CIVIL SUPPLIES be pleased to state:

- (a) what steps are being taken by Government to ensure adequate supply of rice and wheat to the people of Orissa who are in acute distress due to natural calamities in that State; and
- (b) what is the actual quantity of rice and wheat supplied to Orissa from the Central pool between the period from the 1st January, 1983 to 30th June, 1983?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD AND CIVIL SUPPLIES (SHRI BHAGWAT JHA AZAD): (a) and (b) The State Government of Orissa were allotted 88.000 tonnes of *rice* and 1,50,600 tonnes of wheat during the period from January to June. 1983. As against this, the offtake of rice and wheat by the State was 79,200 tonnes and 1,29,400 tones respectively.

The normal monthly allocations of rice and wheat for public distribution in Orissa were increased from time to time as under:—

RICE: An increase of 5,000 tonnes for month during April and May. 1983 and 10,000 ton <-s since June, 1983 was allow-

ed over the January, 1983 allocation of 10,000 tonnes.

to Questions

An extra *ad hoc* allocation of 8,000 tonnes of rice was allowed for February, 1983.

WHEAT (For Public Distribution System): An increase of 5,000 tonnes per month during April, 1983 and May, 1983 and 8,000 tonnes since June, 1983 was allowed over the January, 1983 allocatio* of 12,000 tonnes.

Extra ad hoc allocations of 5;000 ton nes for January, 1983 and 10,000 ton nes for February, 1983 were also allow ed

In addition, allocations of wheat aggregating to 12,285 tonnes were also made to the State Government under the Employment Generation Scheme during the period.

At the request of the State Governmmt, they were permitted to purchase SO.ftOfi tonnes of levy-free rice from the surplus States—20,000 tonnes from Andhra Pca-desh and 10,000 tonnes from Punjab/ Haryana.
