THE MINISTER OF STATEE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI SHRIPRAKASH JAISWAL): (a) Some parts of Balaghat, Dindori and Mandla districts in Madhya Pradesh are affected by naxalism.

(b) and (c) The request of the State Government to include Reeva, Sidhi, Shahdol and Umeriya districts under the Security Related Expenditure (SRE), Scheme was examined by the Central Government. However, keeping in view the extent of naxal activities in these districts, it was felt

that the State Government can deal with the problem **at** its level without getting financial assistance under the SRE Scheme.
