**Gujarat control of Organized Crime Bill, 2003**

931. SHRI KANJIBHAI PATEL: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Gujarat Control of Organized Crime Bill, 2003 has been pending with the Central Government for their approval;

(b) if so, the reasons therefor; and

(c) by when the approval is likely to be accorded by Government?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI S. REGUPATHY): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) and (c) The State Legislations are examined from three angles viz. (i) repugnancy with Central Laws (ii) deviation from National or Central Policy and (iii) legal and constitutional validity. In the case of Gujarat Control of Organized Crime Bill, 2003 there are policy issues which need to be sorted out and no time-frame can be fixed for achieving the same.
